

# THE PAPER RETRIEVER COLLECTION PROGRAM GENERATES \$\$ FOR OUR SCHOOLS



Since the program's inception during the 00/01 school year through September 2006, Parkway has recovered 7,937.3 tons and generated \$82,213 in discretionary revenue for the participating schools through the Abitibi *Paper Retriever* drop off program. Every Parkway School has one or more of the above collection bins located on their individual school campus. The schools can earn a minimum of \$5/ton up to \$15/ton depending on the volumes a school recovers in a one month period. In addition, Abitibi hosts an annual contest in which the schools can earn additional cash. For the last three years, in the single bin category, either Ross elementary (2005) or Northeast Middle (2004 and 2006) have finished first. The total additional revenue generated for the two schools has been \$3,800. In the year that Ross finished first, Northeast Middle finished second and in 2004 and 2006, Ross finished second behind Northeast Middle. **What CAN BE COLLECTED** in the Paper Retriever bins: newspaper, magazines, catalogs, office paper, junk mail, stickie notes, construction paper, nonmetallic gift wrapping paper, paper back books, file folders.

**What CANNOT BE COLLECTED** in the Paper Retriever bins: cardboard, chipboard, phone books, kraft paper, hardbound books, any paper with a wax coating, laminated paper, plastic, glass or metal
