

Recommendations for Teachers: Storing and Using *DE streaming* Video

1. Selecting and storing clips

- a) You may stream *DE streaming* video in order to preview content.
- b) Download the videos for use in the classroom. By utilizing the download feature, you can avoid the problems that sometimes occur with Internet interruptions and limited bandwidth.
- c) Video can be stored by:
 - Saving onto your computer's hard drive
 - Saving onto a flash/jump drive
 - Burning to CD or DVD.
- d) Notes:
 - *DE streaming* video may NOT be stored on a district server.
 - Space:
 - 1 minute of video equals approximately 1.9 MB of storage.
 - A CD holds about 700 MB; a DVD holds about 4GB.
 - *DE streaming* is available 24/7.

2. Displaying *DE streaming* video in a whole classroom setting

- a) Play the video on your computer and display it using any of the following:
 - Data Projector
 - Computer Monitor
 - SMART Board
- b) NOTE: Using a DVD player is not recommended. Some DVD players will play CDs and DVDs created by a computer, but others won't. Be sure you understand the capabilities of the DVD player you intend to use if you decide to take this approach.

3. Incorporating *DE streaming* content into presentations and projects

DE streaming video, images and sound effects can be used in these applications and others:

- a) PowerPoint
- b) Word
- c) MovieMaker
- d) SMART Notebook

NOTE: you can modify videos that are designated as "editable."

4. Student access to *DE streaming* content

- a) Teachers can create student accounts. Do NOT log students in on the teacher's account.
- b) Teachers should use the Assignment Builder to direct students to pre-selected videos and clips. Students access the assignment by using an assignment passcode.
- c) Teachers should download videos and clips ahead of time if their students will be using them in powerpoint or other presentations.
