CADET TEACHING

CADET TEACH

1/2 Credit (semester)

Prerequisite: Junior or senior standing, approval of student's counselor and teacher for whom the student will cadet. The student must have a career GPA of 3.0 or better and a grade of B or better in the subject that he/she is to cadet teach, or administrative approval. (Maximum Enrollment: One class per day). The student is limited to 1.000 credit total in Cadet Teaching.

This course provides students with an opportunity to use their knowledge, time, ideas and energy in a very practical setting. Students are assigned as classroom assistants to a teacher at South High or at one of the feeder schools. Cadet teachers will be provided opportunities to tutor individual students, conduct review sessions with small groups, and present short lessons to a class. Students will also keep a journal of their classroom teaching experiences and write a short response to educational questions.

To be eligible for Cadet Teaching, the student must complete a Cadet Teaching Application form prior to registration. On that form, the student must obtain the signature of the teacher for whom the student wishes to cadet teach. Forms are available in the Career and Counseling Center. Completed forms should be submitted to the Career and Counseling Center together with the student's registration form. Transportation to the feeder schools is the responsibility of the student.

INDEPENDENT STUDY ACTIVITIES

INDEP STUDY

1/2 Credit per semester (1 or 2 semesters)

Prerequisite: Senior standing and approval of principal.

This program is designed to give students learning experiences, which are not available in the traditional program. Students may pursue an area of interest through Independent Study Activities by special agreement with an instructor and approval by the coordinator. By extending the classroom, students may have the opportunity to perform a community service, to do special research in an area of interest, to study on a college campus, or to explore a career. Students should see their counselor for details.

DUAL ENROLLMENT

DUAL ENROLL

Seniors are given the opportunity to expand their high school schedule by attending college during the school day. To qualify for the dual enrollment program seniors must fulfill the following requirements:

- Have a grade point average of 2.5 or higher
- Have a high school transcript sent to the Admissions Office
- Have permission of the high school
- Take required entry assessment tests

Local colleges and junior colleges cooperate with South High in providing education opportunities for seniors who desire to investigate career options and earn college credit while continuing to attend high school on a partial schedule. In the junior year, students should investigate with their counselor ways to merge their schedule with enrollment in college classes.

1/2 Credit (semester)

Prerequisite: Senior standing
